Topic Overview

As the theme suggests, this term is going to get a little bit messy! We will begin the learning for Muck, Mess and Mixtures on Friday 6th January when we have our 'Messy Mixtures Wow Morning'! The children will be able to visit the 'Experimenting Room', the 'Investigating Room' and the 'Exploring Room' as they experience a variety of weird and wonderful mixtures. Please ensure on that day, your child comes into school in old clothes which can get messy and/or a change of clothes in case they get wet!

We will be using the text *George's Marvellous Medicine* as a stimulus for our narrative writing and instructions. We will also be using the wonderful text *'The Day the Crayons Quit'* by Oliver Jeffers for our focus on developing letter writing skills.

This theme has a focus on Art and we will be visiting the Usher Gallery on Tuesday 31st January to participate in clay workshops. Our Science this term will have a particular focus on working scientifically, which will include lots of predicting, observing, testing and answering questions.

Our final week of term will be an International week, where we study Rukungiri in Uganda and make comparisons to our own locality and lifestyle. We will also incorporate fundraising activities in order to sponsor two children to attend the school in Rukungiri for another year. The children will learn about how they can make a positive difference to others in the world.

Our **British Values focus strand** will be *'The Rule of the Law'* and we will be exploring the difference between right or wrong and why we have 'rules' both in the context of school and society. We will also develop children's ability to accept responsibility for their behaviour and to understand the consequences of actions. We will present scenarios to help them resolve conflicts effectively with the aim of developing their understanding that living under the rule of law protects them and is essential for wellbeing and safety.
